

REPORT On NEETI TALKS On “CONSTITUTIONALISM”

On **21 November 2021**, at 4pm “The NEETI FORUM” (part of JSSLC, IQAC wing) had organized “NEETI TALKS”. On the topic, “Constitutionalism”- by Justice G.S. Singhvi, Judge (Retd.), Supreme Court of India, through virtual mood via zoom platform, which was witnessed, by around 70 participants and the webinar was streamed live on You Tube, which has gained around 145 views within an hour. The host of this webinar was Ms. Prajna SN and Ms. Nikita Susan Eapen introduced the Guest Speaker. Dr. S. Nataraju, Principal, welcomed the guest and the gathering.

At 4:10 pm, Justice began his speech by explaining the beauty and importance of the Preamble of the Constitution of the India in order understand the constitutionalism. Further, Justice Singhvi stressed upon Article 32 and Article 226 and 227 during his speech and according to him Article 226 and 227 not only gives wider power to the High Courts across the country but are important to the common persons as well. He opined that, not every citizen from various parts of the country will be able to reach Delhi to invoke Article 32 and yes, it is the truth! His Lordship expressed his concern pertaining to the granting of bail on surety. In a country like India where people strive for square meal a day, it is impossible for many of the poor and falsely accused persons to deposit the surety amount. As a result of the same, even after granting of bail, due to non-payment of surety amount they continue to remain in jail ranging from almost 8 months to 2 years!



Following the Lecture, from 04:45pm, the meet was open for questions from the students and his Lordship interacted with them by answering the questions with reference to the constitutional provisions and its practical aspect on par with his experience. Justice Singhvi, insisted the students and the young generation to give back something to the society by serving the society because we all gain something or other from society.
