The Member Secretary welcomed the members and made presentation. The meeting was held through both online/offline.

The following resolutions were passed during the deliberations of the meeting:

Agenda 30.1: Reading and recording of the Proceedings of the 29th Academic Council Meeting.

The member-secretary briefed the proceedings of the previous 29th AC meeting and also about the action taken report to the members. The suggestions made in the previous

29th AC meeting held on 13th June, 2022, were briefed to the members; where, Sri. Y G Muralidharan emphasized the need to stress on students to write articles in newspapers, blogs etc. and suggested the requirement to conduct workshop on How to write article. He also suggested re-orienting the subjects with latest requirements of the society. It was clarified that the efforts are on to motivate the students to write articles through 'DRUSTI' wall Magazine of the College.

Decision: It was accepted and implemented.

Agenda 30.2 APPROVAL OF THE 22nd RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE BOS (UG)

From the matters discussed during the 22nd BOS (UG) meeting held on 29.10.2022 the following recommendations have been arrived by the members of the BOS (UG) which are to be placed before the Academic Council.

- **Land Laws:** It was resolved to rectify the nomenclature of the statute - the Registration Act, 1908 in Unit II of Land Laws.
- **Public Health Law:** It was resolved to include the topic on the National Commission for Allied and Health Care Professionals/Institutions in Unit II of Public Health Law.
- **Sociology I and II:** It was resolved to update topics in Unit II, III & IV of Sociology I and II as suggested by the course teacher from the academic year 2023-24.
- **Introduction of new course - Legal Methods and Research:** Based on the observation by the KSLU Autonomy Review Committee it was resolved to introduce Legal Methods and Research as a new course during first year (First Semester) of BA and BBA., LL.B (Hons.) Programme and the draft syllabus was placed for discussion and approval in the meeting by Dr. S. Nataraju.
- **Shuffling of Optional Papers and Identifying core papers:** it was resolved to carryout bifurcation of core and optional papers as observed by KSLU Autonomy Review Committee. RTI, Law of Banking, Land Laws, IPR to be retained as core paper and Human Rights Law, Competition Law, Employment Law, Sports Law etc to be considered for optional papers.
- **Kannada Kali:** It was resolved to shift the Kannada Kali paper from second semester to first semester for Three Years LL.B Programme.
- **Modification in CIA components:** it was resolved modify the CIA components for the academic year 2022-23 – 1) Unit I - Pick & Speak (4 marks), 2) IA (Unit II & III) (10 marks), 3) Online Test (Unit IV) (5 marks), 4) Assignment/Presentations (all units) (5 marks), 5) Class notes and Practical (6 marks) – Total 30 marks.
- **Bilingual Policy under NEP:** it was resolved to consider bilingual policy in teaching.
- The members formally informed and discussed the proposal for Integration of JSS Law College with JSS AHER as new Faculty of Law and Progressive Disaffiliation from KSLU.

- **Civil Procedure Code:** It was resolved to consider the recommendation of Sri. Somashekar, Retired Judge, to include the topic on Commercial Courts Act in Unit V of CPC.
- **Decision: It was accepted.**

Agenda 30.3 RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE 22nd BOS (PG) TO THE ACADEMIC COUNCIL

The following are the recommendations of the Board of Studies (PG) (Meeting held on 28/10/2022) for the approval from the Academic Council:

- Publication of papers, articles and write ups in journals is a must for the PG students not only to get better grades, but also for evaluation as part of IA component.
- Proposal by the external member to start 1 year PG program on Investment Laws in coordination with Ministry of Corporate Affairs to be considered for future.
- Proposal to conduct the classes for PG program with flexible timings so that the advocates can join the course thereby increasing the admissions of PG students in accordance with the BCI notification.
- Proposal to hold a National Level Conclave on deliberations in Masters Programmes' in Law by inviting stakeholders from National Law Schools, Law Universities, KSLU, autonomous colleges and other Law colleges during the academic year.
